## Planning for a Green Expansion

Calcutta House will expand into a third facility in order to meet the demand for housing in Philadelphia for those diagnosed with full-blown AIDS. Several sites are being considered in the surrounding area of North Philadelphia, according to the Expansion Committee of Calcutta House. This committee was assembled after last summer's strategic planning sessions led board members and staff to realize that the need for housing, especially for families with a parent who has full blown AIDS, was not being met.

The new expansion project will be two buildings. The first building will be two bed-

room apartments for families. This will allow families to stay together, whereas currently parents who need rehabilitative care face an unpleasant dilemma: leave their children behind or not receive treatment. Our goal will be to foster family connectedness while ensuring that our residents get the nursing, psychosocial, nutritional and personal care services necessary to rebuild their lives. Adult men & women will both be admitted into the program allowing families to remain intact.

The second building will be a personal care home, similar to our current facilities, with individual rooms allowing for

rehabilitative care with the goal of helping residents to learn to live independently in the future.

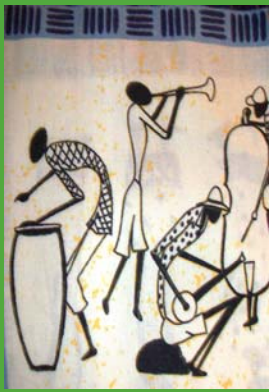
Our building expansion plans include a preference for a green facility. Incorporating green spaces throughout with a planned garden and courtyard, we will also attempt to incorporate the use of recycled materials in the construction of the facilities. Other green measures will include automatic shut-off faucets, low-flow toilets, energy-saver light fixtures, paperless bathrooms, and recycling of paper, plastic, and cans. Several locations are under consideration with a decision expected by 2009.

## Passing the Torch

As I move on to a new position and mission in the non-profit sector, I have every confidence that I leave Calcutta House in extremely competent hands. Kim McGrory and the team are so talented, and strongly connected to the mission as anyone could be. ## Miracles in Progress: Nancy

Just ask **Nancy**. She was homeless and estranged from her family when she arrived at Calcutta House 3 years ago. Nancy's family was no longer willing to take her in-leaving her without housing upon being discharged from the hospital. Her fiancé would soon die of AIDS, and her oldest son refused to speak to her. Nancy admits that in her darkest

hour she felt she had nothing to live for-until Calcutta House gave her the support and strength of a nurturing family to rebuild her life. She has reconnected with her son and sister, and is now active in speaking at AIDS awareness events for local high schools and universities. A Calcutta House miracle who has defied the odds and learned to live again, she feels that each day she continues to change for the better.

**Lorraine** came to Calcutta House in 1998. She was very sick, and learned that her CD4 count was 39, at which point one is considered to have full-blown AIDS. She did not want to die, but she did not know how to find the will to live again. Facing death, she felt that this was the last opportunity for peace in her life.

She learned that she could not only recover, but that she could have a better life. She feels not only a purpose for living, but a newfound sense of joy that she expresses in

her poetry. An excerpt from one of Lorraine's poems:

*Today we woke up with ability to see, walk, talk and hear.*

*Today we should be thankful that we are still in our right mind..*

*Today we should all thank God for allowing us to see another day.*

*Today we should do all we can, when we can; because tomorrow isn't promised to us.*

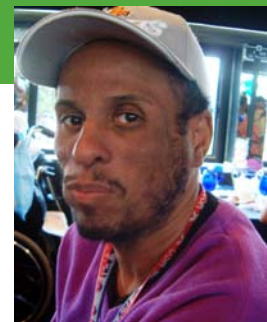

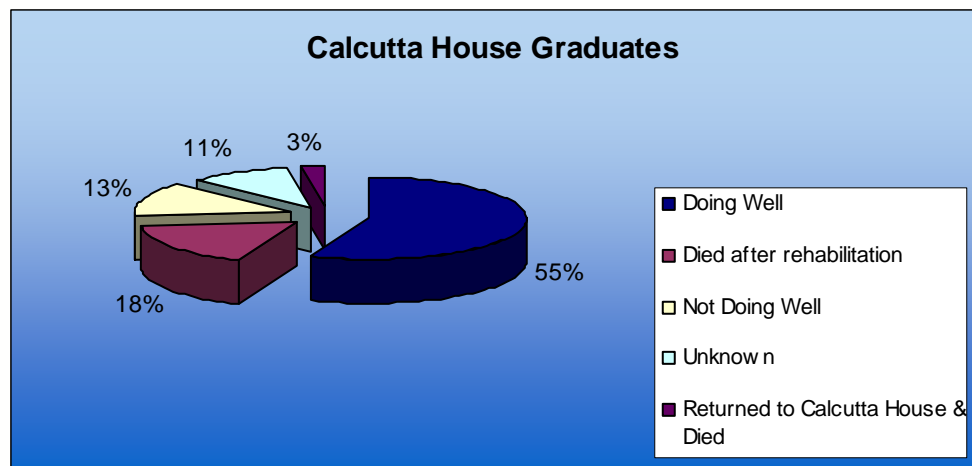


**SAPPHIRE FUND**

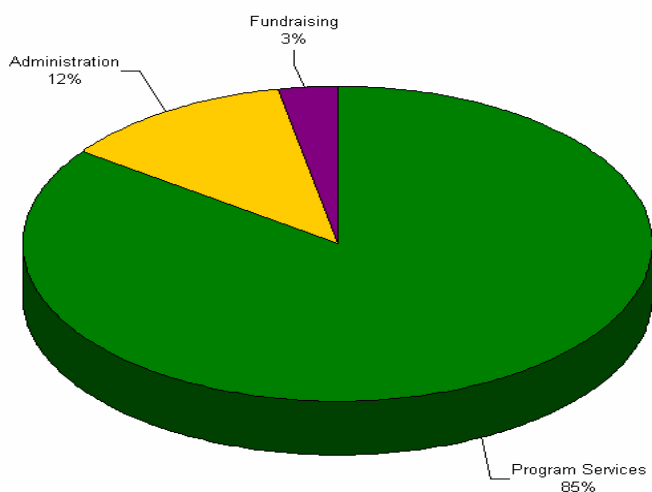

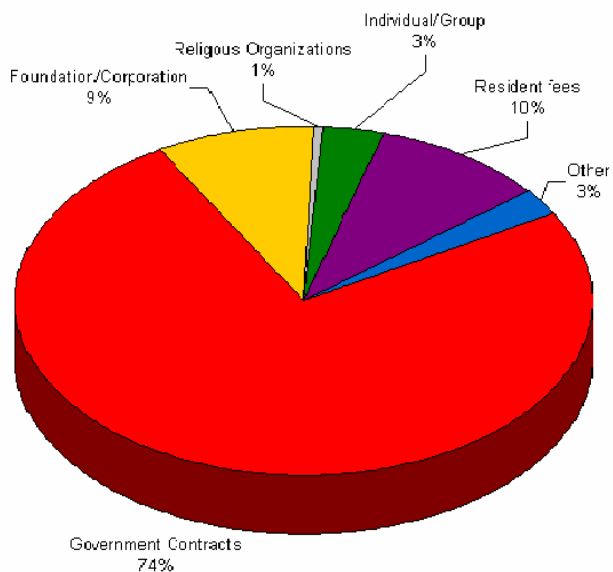
